

Community Arts Worker

Children at KSV come from rural environments with few contacts with the outside world. The aim of having a Community Arts Worker is to open their minds to the world and to stimulate their creativity.

This volunteer will organize artistic, creative and educational workshops. He/She is in charge of the art classes (drawing, sculpting, painting, craft, stitching, etc.) for all the academic levels and takes care every morning of the youngest children who have less music classes by offering them different activities. Some time slots are kept for preparing the classes.



We welcome any project which can help the children in their growth and development. If you have some particular artistic/cultural skills – in dance, fine arts, music, computers, theatre... – you can offer a personal project to the children of the school and introduce them to your discipline with the aim of presenting the results at the end of your stay. The KSV team can help you with the organisation.

In addition, you can show movies, initiate children to art or music history, organise educational visits, make them listen to other styles of music. This task gives you significant freedom of action and allows you to share your passions with the KSV students.



Tasks

- * Animating the Art Classes,
- * Animating artistic workshops for the youngest children,
- * Initiating some projects of creation in the field of your choice,
- * Stimulating the curiosity and openness of the children by making them discover new artistic fields, organizing educational visits,
- * Assisting music teachers and giving basic lessons for the youngest students (optional).

- * Interest for art and willingness to share your knowledge,
- * Communication skills to share your passion,
- * Previous experience with children is preferable,
- * Creativity,
- * Patience and open-mindedness,
- * Organizational capacities,
- * Interest for the growth and well-being of children.
