

English Teacher

English teachers have an important role at KSV. They teach this subject alongside our Indian teachers for the levels from 1st year of primary school till the last year of secondary school. Each volunteer teaches two Standards (levels) which represent at least three periods a day. Volunteers plan and prepare the lessons following the school syllabus and can use manuals available here. A notebook has to be filed every day with all the activities made in class. This prevents repeating lessons and it also serves as an important guide for future volunteers. Some free time is provided to prepare the lessons and to correct the homework. We ask each volunteer to manage tuition classes for the children who have difficulties in English, reading classes in English (a group of 2 children) and the weekly game class for the level you teach.



English teachers, like the wardens and head of healthcare, have the most important relationship with the children and are, of course, the school's *raison d'être*.

The contact between the students and the foreign volunteers allows them to extend their vision of the world and to develop self-confidence.



Tasks

- * Teaching English to two Standards (from 1st year of primary school till the last year of secondary school),
- * Preparing lessons and correct homework,
- * Filling the lessons notebook each day,
- * Giving English tuition classes,
- * Giving English reading classes,
- * Managing games classes,
- * Helping during the academic exams (if they are held during your stay).

Competences and qualities

- * Previous experience in teaching is desired,
- * Experience with children,
- * Fluent level of spoken and written English,
- * Patience and open mindedness,
- * Creativity and originality,
- * Being respectful and fair,
- * Interest in growth and well-being of children.

However, a person who never taught before with a personality which corresponds to the qualities mentioned above can find a way to teach while having fun doing it!
