Instrument set my hand this twenty ninth day of January one thousand

ment in the presence of no person at the same time whereat the ex-

Evans Doctor of Law and Attorney by the oaths of James Durban the
Testator and Chudleigh executors to whom power was granted

or about my person at the time of my death and all the money
I have in the funds and all the securities of mine for money or book
debts or bonds bills notes and all other securities and all and every
other my lands and effects whatsoever or whatsoever both real and
personal whether in possession or reversion or in expectancy. I ap-
point after my funeral expenses and all my just and lawful debts are
paid to dispose of as thereafter mentioned. And I hereby appoint my
