Elizabeth Sarah Shepherd of "Newdean" Purley this
Purley in the County of Surrey Spinster I appoint the London
 County and Westminster and Paris Bank Limited
 (hereinafter called "the Bank") to be Executor and Trustee of
 this my Will with power to act by its proper officers who may
 exercise and perform the powers and duties given to or imposed
 on the Bank as such Executor and Trustee. And I declare that
 the Bank may employ a Solicitor, Broker or any other agent to
 transact all or any business of whatsoever nature required to be
 done hereunder including the receipt and payment of money but
 not including the exercise of any discretion and shall be entitled
 to be allowed and paid all charges and expenses so incurred
 and further that the Bank shall be entitled to remuneration
 including the customary share of brokerage in accordance with
 the Bank's scale of fees now in force free from duties and in
 priority to all other payments. I desire that the Solicitors (if
 any) to be employed in connection with my estate shall if
 possible be Messrs. Sanders Hervey & Knight of Popford I.C.
 but without prejudice to the right of the Bank to consult or
 employ any other Solicitors if it should so desire. The Bank
 may without being liable to account for any profit made thereby
 act as Banker and transact any banking business on behalf
 of my estate or the trusts of my Will and may retain on ac-
 current or deposit account or may advance any moneys if
 may be necessary or convenient so to retain or advance on the
 same terms as would be made with a customer in the ordinary
 course of business. I give the following legacies free of duty
 namely To my friends Ellen Amelia Prior and Emily Louisa
 Prior of 28 Pendrell Road, Brockley I.C. the sum of One
 hundred pounds each. I give all my property both real and
 personal unto the Bank Upon trust (after paying thereout
 my just debts and funeral and testamentary expenses and the
 legacies bequeathed by this my Will or any Codicil thereto)
 to divide the same into four equal parts and to pay one
 of such equal fourth parts to each of my sisters Annie
 Jane Pyare Bell and Jessie Morris Purham and to divide
 one other equal fourth part equally between the children of
 my late brother Charles Messingham Shepherd who may be

living at the date of my death and if there shall be only one such child the whole for that one child and to divide the remaining one fourth part equally between the children of my late sister Florence Thomason Montgomery who may be living at the date of my death and if there shall be only one such child the whole for that one child. Provided always that if either of my said sisters Annie Jane Ryan Bell and Jessie Morris Durham shall predecease me leaving a child or children living at my death and being a son or sons shall attain or have attained the age of twenty one years or being a daughter or daughters shall attain or have attained that age or marry under that age then and in every such case such child or children shall take and if more than one equally between them the share which his law or their parent would have taken if such parent had survived me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand to this my Will this Twenty seventh day of May - - One thousand nine hundred and eighteen.
