Henry James Smith of Aubyn Lodge Avenue Road Bexley Heath in the County of Kent Gentleman I revoke all prior testamentary dispositions made by me I appoint William Middlebrooke Bishop of "Eversleigh" No 233 Stanstead Road Forest Hill in the said County of Kent and William Fredericks Williams of Glendon House Longfleet in the County of Dorset (hereinafter called "my Trustees") to be the Executors and Trustees of this my Will I give to my Son William Victor Smith who is now in Australia free of Legacy Duty the Seal and Chain which belonged to my late Father William Smith I give to my Housekeeper Charlotte Bacon the sum of Fifty Pounds free from Legacy Duty And as to all my property not hereby otherwise disposed of I give the same unto my Trustees In Trust to convert the same into money by sale or otherwise and to divide the proceeds (after paying thereout my funeral and testamentary expenses and debts and the Legacy herebefore bequeathed) among all my children in equal shares as tenants in common
